Mid-Maine Technical Center, in partnership with Kennebec Valley Community College, will be offering MMTC students the opportunity to take free college courses on campus. MMTC will cover the cost of tuition, fees and textbooks, a savings to the student of more than \$400. Upon successful completion of a course, students will earn three college credits through Kennebec Valley Community College. These credits are transferrable throughout the Maine Community College and University of Maine College systems.

MMTC will offer the following courses in the fall, one or both of which are required of most post-secondary majors.

ENG-101: College Composition

September 1 - December 10 Tuesdays and Thursdays 2:00 – 3:20 p.m.

College Composition emphasizes critical reading and thinking as part of the process of clear and effective writing. Students will be required to conduct research and write essays based on that research. This course values the process of writing and students will actively engage in the revision process.

MAT-114: Technical Math

August 31 - December 9 Mondays and Wednesdays 2:00 – 3:20 p.m.

This course will provide students with the concepts, principles, and problem-solving techniques and skills needed in diverse occupational fields. Interactive techniques will be used which emphasize an understanding of the topics followed by applications of math concepts using problem solving computations. Topics covered include the numbering system, percent, charts, tables and graphs, calculations in both S. I. (metric) and the English systems, algebraic operations, simple equations, ratio and proportions, fundamentals of plane geometry, angular measure, triangles, area and volume calculations of various geometric shapes, introduction to right angle trigonometry.
